In August, three Automated CPR Devices arrived, stationed on ambulances at the Central Newfoundland Regional Heath Centre, the Baie Verte Peninsula Health Centre and at Green Bay Health Centre. Their **impact on patient care was immediate -** we are proud to tell you that several lives have already been saved thanks to this sophisticated tool for our paramedics.

We are eagerly awaiting the arrival of two infant cardiac monitors for the Obstetrics Unit and a Remote Cardiac Monitoring System for the Cardiopulmonary Department at the Regional Health Centre in Grand Falls-Windsor. We know this equipment will make a world of difference for our patients awaiting diagnosis.

We would like to recognize Central Health for purchasing and putting two pieces of equipment that were on our campaign list - a Transport Ventilator and an Echo Stretcher - into service earlier in the year, as a response to the pandemic.
